Farming Safety

hat's more peaceful sounding than a family farm? In reality, it can be one of the most dangerous places to work. Farming involves a wide range of chores, many of which are physically demanding and must be performed in all kinds of weather. With the arrival of Spring and the busy season, farmers might work 12 to 18 hours every day of the week. Machinery is involved in about 50% of all farm injuries. Respiratory irritation is another sort of danger for farmers because of the toxic fumes associated with farming.

Since most farm accidents take place at this busy time of the year, farmers need to remind themselves of their practical safety instincts, such as:

- Never take machinery for granted
- Never reach into equipment with moving parts or when making repairs
- Be sure equipment is turned off and don't remove safety shields or guards
- Avoid baggy clothing because they can catch in machinery too easily Continued on page 3




Volunteer Appreciation Week April 19th-25th

ue to the great response we had last year, Annie Jeffrey Health Center held their second AJ Snowman Marathon, a community health and fitness event. Participants competed in a 6-week, 26.2 mile marathon that began in January and ended at the Spring Health Fair on March 4, 2010. The overall purpose of the Snowman Marathon was to help participants establish a routine of regular activity and healthy eating by providing weekly goals, nutrition information, and keeping motivated with fun, prizes and camaraderie. An additional feature of this year's challenge was the team division. Family, co-workers and friends were encouraged to form teams of 2-4 people. The goal of the team was to encourage all members to complete their miles in order for all of the other team members to receive their weekly prizes.





The event kicked off with our 5-star Dietary Department catering a spaghetti meal while marathoners learned about exciting new research in healthy eating from our Registered Dietitian, Sandra Burwell. Two additional nutrition information sessions were also presented. During these sessions, participants shared their progress, gained new tips for success and learned about healthy cooking techniques and recipes. All participants received free access to the Wellness Center for 6 weeks, body fat testing, and blood pressure screening. Free lab testing was available during the first week of the competition and low-cost follow-up testing was available during the Spring Health Fair.

BryanLGH Grant

nnie Jeffrey Health Center and the surrounding communities will benefit from a \$10,000 grant made by the BryanLGH Foundation Primary Care Matching Grants Program. At its most recent board meeting, the BryanLGH Foundation Board approved the grant award to the Foundation for Annie Jeffrey to assist with the purchase of a new anesthesia machine.

The Foundation for Annie Jeffrey is a non-profit corporation organized to provide funding for projects (such as new medical equipment or facility renovations) that promote health care in the communities served by Annie Jeffrey Health Center. The Foundation is governed by an eight-person volunteer board. The hospital foundation keeps track of funds which are donated and for what purpose they are donated; seeks grants and other outside funding; provides tax reports to the IRS; recognizes donors in newsletters and on our Wall of Commitment; helps publish quarterly newsletters; plans fund raising events; and participates in numerous hospital and clinic activities. Donations to the foundation qualify as tax-deductible charitable gifts.

Proceeds from the Foundation's annual campaign will be used to fund the balance of the anesthesia machine.

The BryanLGH Foundation Primary Care Matching Grants Program funds programs or services that improve the quality of health care or increases access to health care in the community. Since the program's inception in 1997, the Foundation has awarded 149 grants to primary health care organizations across the state totaling over \$1.2 million.

Organizations requesting grant funds from the BryanLGH Foundation Matching Grants Program must have not-for-profit 501c3 or other tax-exempt status and must be able to match at least half of the funds required for the project. Preference is given to Nebraska-based organizations.

At their February meeting, the Foundation for Annie Jeffrey gave a check to Annie Jeffrey Health Center to pay for the \$28,000 anesthesia machine. The Foundation for Annie Jeffrey is a non-profit corporation for promotion of health care in the community served by Annie Jeffrey Health Center.


