Annie Jeffrey Health Fair Slated for Oct. 3

A nnie Jeffrey Memorial County
Health Center is always taking
precautionary steps to protect our patients,
community members and staff from the
exposure and spread of any illness
including COVID-19. Annie Jeffrey Health
Center wants to continue to be able to
offer discounted health screening services
to fair goers. That being said Annie Jeffrey
Memorial County Health Center is pleased
to announce we will be proceeding with
our 19th Annual Health Fair on Tuesday,
October 3rd. This year's event will have
discounted blood draws and flu shots will
be available.

The health fair will be held at the Annie Jeffrey Memorial County Health Center in Osceola. If you are experiencing cold or flu symptoms including but not limited to fever, coughing and/or shortness of breath, if you or a member of your family have traveled from an area where COVID-19 is spreading or if you or a member of your family have been in close

contact to or exposed to someone with a confirmed case of COVID-19 we ask that you do not attend the health fair. This year's event will be held from 6:45 a.m. until 11:00 a.m.

Annie Jeffrey Health Center will be providing comprehensive blood screening profiles including general blood chemistry analysis, cholesterol profile, and complete blood cell count at a discounted rate of \$35 (a \$315 value). Thyroid screening (TSH), diabetes screening (Hemoglobin A1C), Vitamin D, and prostate specific antigen (PSA) testing will also be available for \$25 per each additional test requested. All participants who want a blood test are asked to not eat or drink 8-12 hours before the test. You are encouraged to drink as much water as possible to keep hydrated and to take your medications as you usually do. Please bring a self-addressed, stamped legal sized envelope so that your test results can be mailed directly to you.

AJHC Receives Award


A nnie Jeffrey Health Center was recently named one of the top 20 critical access hospitals (CAHs) for the Best Practice in Patient Satisfaction in the country.



Foundation for Annie Jeffrey ANNUAL REPORT

For for our Fiscal year – July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023

he Foundation for Annie Jeffrey is a non-profit corporation organized to provide funding for projects (such as new medical equipment or facility renovations) that promote health care in the communities served by Annie Jeffrey Health Center. The Foundation is governed by a nine-person volunteer board. The hospital foundation keeps track of funds which are donated and for what purpose they are donated; seeks grants and other outside funding; provides tax reports to the IRS; recognizes donors in newsletters and on our Wall of Commitment; helps publish quarterly newsletters; plans fund raising events; and participates in numerous hospital and clinic activities. Donations to the *Foundation* qualify as tax-deductible charitable gifts.

Here is a recap of the past years events and activities.

In September, the Foundation for Annie Jeffrey kicked off its annual campaign to raise money to purchase new Radiology room equipment. At their February meeting, the Foundation for Annie Jeffrey Board of Directors voted to donate \$75,000 from their annual campaign to Annie Jeffrey Health Center to help purchase new Radiology room equipment.

The Annie Jeffrey Volunteers

celebrated their 27th anniversary in November.

In November, the *Foundation* paid \$6,500 for a new stepper for the Wellness Center after receiving a generous gift for this equipment.

The annual Foundation Family Tree Celebration was held in December. Funds raised from this event were used to help fund new equipment. This event allows community members to purchase ornaments to hang on a Christmas tree at Annie Jeffrey Health Center to remember and honor loved ones.

The Foundation received a \$5,500 donation from the Annie Jeffrey Volunteers at their annual Christmas Party. The Annie Jeffrey Volunteers run the Thrift Shop in downtown Osceola and donate their proceeds to help the hospital pay for special items. They have donated over \$135,000 over 27 years to the hospital. Annie Jeffrey Health Center honored the Annie Jeffrey Volunteers with a brunch and program in April.

In February the *Foundation* held their annual Wine & Beer Fest fundraiser at The Rose Colored Glass in Stromsburg. The money raised from ticket sales and the silent auction helped with the annual campaign.

In February, the *Foundation* paid for new pictures in the hospital after receiving a generous donation for them.

The Foundation for Annie Jeffrey awards scholarships to the following

high schools: Shelby/Rising City High School, Cross Country High School, Osceola High School and High-Plains High School. The winners of this year's Foundation for Annie Jeffrey scholarships are: Kirsten Glatter, Sierra Boden, Elizabeth Hoffman, Emma Jones, Saylar Osentowski, Hailey Lindburg and Kenzie Wruble. These scholarships are in addition to the scholarships offered to Annie Jeffrey employees. Since 2012, the Foundation for Annie Jeffrey has awarded 53 scholarships to kids in Polk County with some of those students returning to work at Annie Jeffrey.

Annie Jeffrey Health Fair Slated for Oct. 3 continued.

The Comprehensive Blood Screening Profile provides information on your body's ability to fight infection along with helping identify health issues such as but not limited to anemia, diabetes, heart disease, some clotting disorders, cancers, and liver disease. The thyroid screening, TSH, measures a thyroid stimulating hormone that tells if your thyroid is working too hard or not hard enough.

The diabetes screening, Hemoglobin A1C, measures your average blood sugar for the past 2 to 3 months. This test provides a much better indication of long-term glucose control than a blood glucose.

Vitamin D screening provides a baseline Vitamin D level which is important since insurance companies will not cover this screening unless you are pre-diagnosed with a deficiency. Vitamin D deficiency presents a silent danger, it has been linked to several different illnesses and conditions including osteoporosis, respiratory diseases, high blood pressure, depression, fatigue, mood changes, psoriasis, muscle weakness, bone pain, and kidney problems.

The prostate cancer screening, PSA, measures a prostate specific antigen in men. This protein produced by the prostate gland tells men information about their prostate health.

The Polk County Health Department will also be on site offering seasonal flu shots. Regular flu shots will be available to fair goers for \$35. The Polk County Health Department will also have High Dose Flu shots available for \$76. These are recommended for individuals 65 years of age and older. They will be available at no cost for fair goers with a current Medicare card, this does not include Medicare Advantage plans. Donations will be accepted by the health department to help cover the expense of administering the immunizations.

The Four Corners Health Department will also be on site offering free blood pressure checks. They will also have their skin scope available to provide a free skin analysis evaluating damage caused by the sun.

We hope you choose to take control of your health by attending the Fall Health Fair on October 3rd. Reminder no appointment is necessary that walk-ins are welcome for lab work and flu shots from 6:45 am until 11:00 am. Individuals are encouraged to call 402-747-2031 and ask for Robin or Mindy to address any questions or concerns.

Simulation in Motion

n August, the staff at Annie Jeffrey, along with local EMS trained in a 44-foot-long, customized truck that provides a mobile, real-life experience designed to enhance life-saving skills for those in rural areas.

The SIM trucks are taken to rural emergency medical service agencies and critical access hospitals. This also allows training to be team-based as learners train side-by-side with the people they normally work with. The customized trucks feature dual slide-out room extensions, a simulated emergency room and ambulance, a control room, as well as high-tech, computerized patient



simulators that talk, breathe, have heartbeats, and can react to medications and other actions of the learners. Each mobile unit is equipped to recreate a realistic environment for learners including medical supplies, pre-programmed computerized medical and trauma scenarios; monitors that display vital signs of patient simulators; heart monitors/defibrillators; audio and video recording/playback capabilities and mock drugs.
